Description	This course has been set up to enable students to acquire basic reading skills and vocabulary in order to be able to comprehend at the Faculty Level authentic non-fiction texts that are both academic and general. The student will be able to demonstrate, through completion with tolerable accuracy of a range of tasks involving comprehension of explicit information, the ability to engage meaningfully with a volume of non-fiction, technical / abstract / academic text of a length in the order of 2000 words / hour.
Objectives	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. To teach reading skills and strategies, including how to record facts gleaned from complex, and more academic, text, by means of graphic organisers including tables.</li> <li>2. To familiarise students with ways that more academic text is organised.</li> <li>3. To promote vocabulary recognition and acquisition skills by raising awareness of, among others, polysemy; the distinction between literal and metaphorical usage, word families/affixation; and lexical cohesion.</li> <li>4. To encourage students to practise reading autonomously.</li> </ol>
Learning Outcomes	<p>By the end of Reading 200, learners will be able to:</p> <p>LO1. aided by a dictionary, demonstrate comprehension of significant ideas and details from multi-paragraph texts up to a length of 2000 words;</p> <p>LO2. analyse texts for patterns of discourse organisation such as: popular reports of research, academic article abstracts, and argued opinion;</p> <p>LO3. match paraphrased ideas to ideas/opinions expressed in a text;</p> <p>LO4. to learn enough vocabulary to understand the gist and key points of non-fiction, credible, texts without the aid of a dictionary.;</p> <p>LO5. manage their own practice of and improvement in Reading by finding and exploiting useful texts, without the help of a teacher.</p>
